## Overview

[WriteToThem](#) helps people to send a message to the politicians that represent them, even if they don't know who those politicians are.

Users need only input a postcode on WriteToThem's homepage. They will then see a list of their representatives at every level, including local councillors, MP, and MEPs.

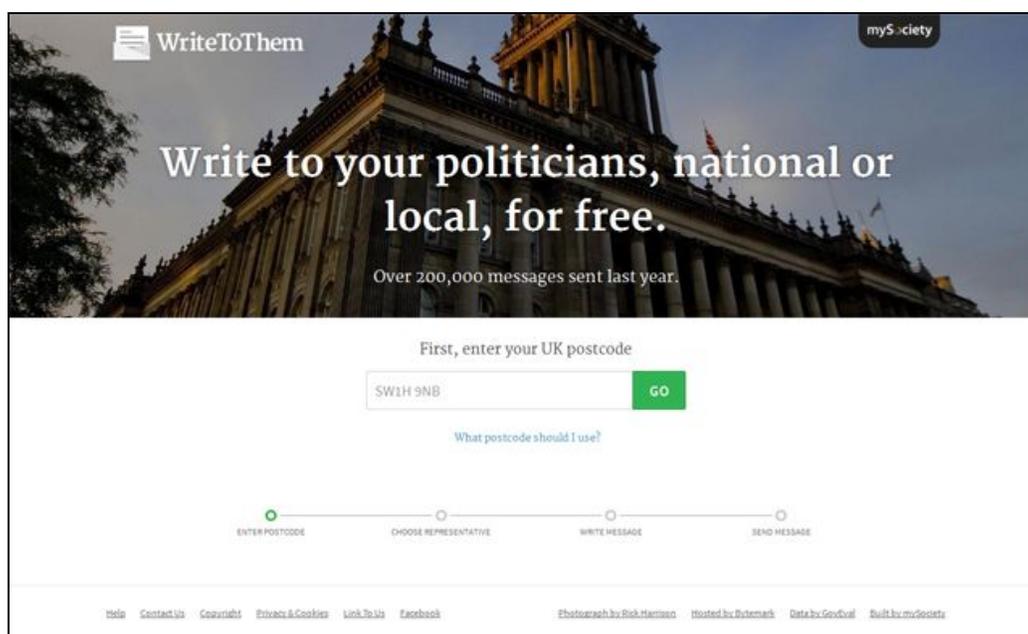
Depending on their location, they may also find London Assembly Members, Members of the Scottish Parliament or the Northern Ireland Assembly.

Users can then choose one of these representatives, and write them a message which is sent by email.

## History



mySociety built WriteToThem to open up access to a simple civic right - the right to have one's opinion represented.

Many people are unaware that they have this right; furthermore, most people cannot name their MPs\*, let alone who represents them in the local council or in Europe. WriteToThem circumvents this issue by requiring just one simple piece of information — your postcode.

The site launched in 2005, growing out of the earlier volunteer-built site FaxYourMP. Like all mySociety sites, the code is open source and may be used or adapted for free.

## Statistics

Two weeks after writing a message via WriteToThem, users are sent a questionnaire email which asks whether or not they received a response.

mySociety run statistics based on these questionnaires annually, putting the results into a 'responsiveness table' - see these [here](#).

## Caveats

Before writing a story about the most and least responsive MPs, please consider the following:

- People are surveyed initially **after 2 weeks**, and if they didn't answer, were surveyed again **after 3 weeks**.

Because of this, and because of the way different people interpret the survey, care should be taken when interpreting the figures.

- Remember, too, that WriteToThem is not the only means by which MPs receive mail.
- Nor should the league table be taken as a ranking of MP's "laziness" - MPs perform many other duties beyond responding to mail.
- Before preparing this table, we contact the lowest performers to ensure that we had the right email addresses for them.
